



The cottages and apartments at The Fountains at Millbrook are nestled on 200 acres of tranquil countryside. Our campus has a rich history stretching back to 1906 when the Right Reverend David Greer founded Hope Farm — later renamed the Greer School — to be a home for children in need of a family and an education. When the property was first converted into a senior living community in 1985, many of the original structures were preserved and repurposed for an elegant and welcoming lifestyle.

## The Highlands

In addition to encompassing the lobby, this group of apartments is also near to a private dining space, the North Lounge, and the Schoolhouse — all accessible via corridor or elevator.

# **Lobby and Lounges**

A soaring three-story room, the Lobby and its associated Lounges are the hub of our community.

### **Schoolhouse**

This is the social center of The Fountains at Millbrook. Constructed in 1914, this historic building contains everything from the library to the arts studio to the country store. This is also where you'll find individual storage areas and administrative offices.

### The Chapel of the Child

This chapel was built in 1915 to serve the children of Hope Farm.

### **Firehouse**

This two-story brick building was built around 1914. Now it contains three stunning apartments.

## **Maintenance Building**


Dating from the 1950s this building retains its initial purpose, serving our community by maintaining the buildings and grounds.

#### **McAlister House**

Built in the late 1950s and renovated into a trio of refined apartments with a wraparound porch, this two-story farmhouse once served as the Greer School's center for home economics.

## **Jonas Apartments**

Connected to the Highlands by an enclosed, heated walkway, this building contains six quiet residences situated around a central sitting area.
