Modern Movies That Highlight the LGBTQ+ Community

Summerland (2020): A period drama about a reclusive writer in World War II England who forms an unexpected bond with a young evacuee, touching on themes of love and acceptance. [Watch Trailer](#)

Brokeback Mountain (2005): A groundbreaking love story between two cowboys in the American West who struggle to reconcile their feelings amid societal expectations. [Watch Trailer](#)

Call Me by Your Name (2017): Set in Italy during the 1980s, it's a poignant tale of a young man's awakening to love and desire during a transformative summer. [Watch Trailer](#)

"[Schitt's Creek](#)" (2015-2020): A comedy series about a wealthy family who loses their fortune and must live in a small town they once bought as a joke, featuring LGBTQ+ characters and themes of acceptance and love. [Watch Trailer](#)

"[A League of Their Own](#)" (2022): A reimagining of the 1992 film, following the lives of the women in the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League and their journey to overcome societal barriers while pursuing their love for baseball during World War II. [Watch Trailer](#)
