### RULES

USGA rules govern all play except when modified by local rules. The "Embedded Ball Rule" is in effect in grass areas only.

WATER HAZARDS: Yellow stakes and/or red lines define the margins.

**LATERAL WATER HAZARDS:** Red stakes and/or red lines define the margins. In the absence of such, the water's edge shall define the margin of the hazard.

BALL DROPS: As an additional option, a ball drop is provided on holes 4 and 18.

GROUND UNDER REPAIR: Defined by white lines.

OUT OF BOUNDS: Defined by nearest inside point of white stakes (Rule 27).

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# IN THE SADDLE FOR LIFE-CHANGING THERAPY



For 10-year-old Brayden Scarsella, spastic hemiplegia causes poor muscle control, muscle stiffness, and weakness. But one 30-minute session on horseback is the physical equivalent of taking 2,500 to 3,000 steps. For Brayden and his family, the enriching, healing power of horses has made all the difference.

"His condition affects every part of his life, and these sessions allow him to live as close to normal as his body will allow him," says Alexandra Scarsella, Brayden's mother.

Brayden is living with a type of cerebral palsy that causes paralysis and motor impairments on one side of the body. To help with his treatment, he attends hippotherapy sessions through Easterseals

at the InStride Therapy Center in Nokomis, Florida. This equine-based program uses horseback riding as a therapeutic treatment to assist with better balance, coordination, and functional mobility in a safe environment.

This life-changing therapy is expensive and not always covered by insurance. Community Life Director Michelle Sayre shared that the payments toward the therapy are a tremendous burden on Brayden's family, but the benefits make it necessary. That's why The Fountains at Lake Pointe Woods and Watermark for Kids teamed up to sponsor Brayden's therapy for six months.

"We're so thankful for the support of The Fountains [at Lake Pointe Woods] and Watermark for Kids as Brayden continues to navigate the path of living every day with spastic hemiplegia," Alexandra shares.



# CATCHING A DREAM

In 2021, The Watermark at Bellingham went beyond it's West Chester, Pennsylvania, community to find the perfect Watermark for Kids match. Once Bellingham's Dining Services Director and Watermark for Kids Champion Mark Albright discovered Camp Dreamcatcher, he wanted to learn more.

Mark met with Camp Dreamcatcher's founder, Patty Hillkirk. She shared her story and explained why she created Camp Dreamcatcher, a nonprofit organization committed to empowering kids impacted by HIV/AIDS. Mark felt an instant connection to Camp Dreamcatcher's mission.

In August, children ages 5–17 attend Camp Dreamcatcher for an opportunity to have fun and express their feelings in a safe, therapeutic environment. Campers may be coping with the HIV/AIDS infection of a family member, the death of one or both parents, or their own HIV/AIDS infection.

The Watermark's associates and residents raised enough funds to send six children to Camp Dreamcatcher in August 2022. Community Life Director Olivia Grandal and Executive Director Teresa Long joined Mark, and presented Patty and the Camp Dreamcatcher team with a check. Mark and Olivia even attended this year's camp as volunteers.

"When touring the camp, we met several children who expressed their love for the camp and the friends they've made throughout the years," explain Mark and Olivia. "We're so grateful for the opportunity to work with Camp Dreamcatcher and benefit the lives of several children."
